

THANK YOU WINGS

Jesus said that He longed to take care of all of His children—which means everyone who would call Him their friend—just like a mother hen takes care of her chicks by huddling them together under her wing.

Which grown ups help to take care of you the way that Jesus wants to be able to take care of us? Can you make a wing with all their names on as you thank God for them?

Write their names or draw a picture of them on the feather outlines, cut them out and then join them together to make a wing of prayer! You could join them together with a glue stick, by popping a hole where the small crosses are on the templates (a grown up can help you with this) and then joining them all together using some split pins or even by threading some wool or string through the holes and tying them together!

Where will you put your wing to remind you to say thank you to God each day for the grown ups who care for you...?

To enjoy this activity you will need...

- ⇒ Feather Templates
- ⇒ Split Pins/Glue Sticks/Wool/String (for joining feathers together)
- ⇒ Felt Tip Pens/Pencils
- ⇒ Scissors
- ⇒ Very Sharp Pencil/Compass Point (for making holes in the feathers if required)

To setup this activity you should...

- ⇒ Ensure that children are assisted in thinking of all of the grown ups they would like to add to their wing, and that an adult pokes the holes in the feather templates with a sharp point if you are joining them this way.

CHICKLETS

Jesus said that He wanted to take care of us just like a mother hen takes care of her chicks!

Can you make a chick by dipping some cotton wool in the gluey paint and sticking it on to the template? You can add some torn tissue paper on too—its great for making wings!

To enjoy this activity you will need...

- ⇒ Chick Templates
- ⇒ Cotton Wool
- ⇒ 2 Parts Yellow Paint Mixed with 1 Part PVA Glue
- ⇒ Yellow Tissue Paper

To setup this activity you should...

- ⇒ Ensure that the children are assisted to coat the whole of the cotton wool ball in the yellow paint/glue mixture and are supported to thoroughly clean their hands afterward to avoid a sticky mess all over the house!
